QUALIFICATIONS

You may be eligible if:

- You are a Pennsylvania resident
- You can finish your bachelor's degree by June 30, 2024 (Participants should already have estimated 80 credits completed).
- You are a former postsecondary student who exited a post-secondary training since Jan. 1, 2021 without obtaining their credential, had a 2.0 GPA (or higher) upon exit, and are currently interested, available, and capable of returning to finish your program.
